I'm also still going to the gym regularly! I joked in my first 2020 sermon that this was decidedly not a New Year's Resolution. The timing just finally stuck around that date. After a big 2019 with huge transitions for my family, our vocations, and losses of loved ones, it felt possible to get the blood flowing (literally) in ways that help keep me energized and focused in ways that regular exercise only can.

I bring this up again because I've been thinking about the energizing, strengthening benefits for body and mind that even a daily walk or stretching routine or active movement of some kind can do for all of us. I got thinking about 'aliveness' and contentment. These two things can seem to represent different ways of being. One suggests exuberant movement and the other seems to connote calm and guiet. But aliveness and contentment are actually very similar, and maybe even the same thing when we peek behind the curtains of our bodies and souls.

Church is for generating aliveness and contentment. What brings you to church that energizes and strengthens your body and soul? What brings you safety and comfort in your body and soul at church? Is this what Rincon is for you and those around you? Are you investing your time, money, and energies here because it's broadening your ability to generate aliveness and contentment the other six days of the week in your work, life, and play?

These questions are behind a lot of the sermons I preach, and the mini-surveys we're doing because really they're behind the core of the faith that we claim to proclaim. Like pushing ourselves at the gym, experiencing aliveness and contentment doesn't come without discomfort or challenge. The benefits are worth it though.

And so is Orange Theory Fitness. What I love about this place is that it only asks that we push ourselves within and beyond what we can do each class. And that builds resilience and new possibilities for the next time. Which is going to be a theme (resilience) I revisit in February! February 5, 2020

RUCC's Creation Care ministry is back in full swing into the new year! Keep on the lookout for events coming up soon.

For starters, here's a great opportunity to make our voices heard statewide for care of creation, democracy, and other issues for the common good, organized by the Grand Canyon chapter of the Sierra Club: **Environmental Day at the AZ Capitol, February 5, 2020, 8:30a.m. – 2:00p.m.**

Join hundreds of advocates for environmental protection and justice, climate action, lands and wildlife conservation, flowing rivers, democracy, and more, in meeting at the Arizona Capitol to let legislators know how much we care about these issues, as well as specific bills. On Environmental Day, we will hear from legislators and meet in teams with our own legislators. Various organizations will also have tables at the event.

To prepare southern Arizonans for Environmental Day, there will be a Volunteer Lobby Workshop on January 30, 2020, 6:00 – 8:00 p.m. at the Historic Y (738 N. 5th Ave.)

Finally, a bus will take the Tucson contingent to the capitol. It'll leave the Historic Y at 5:45 a.m. and return approximately 5:00 p.m. There's no charge for the bus ride.






