incorporates our commitment to safe space where all God's children are welcome and safe, and where they can play and learn in a creative, collaborative, and natural environment.

In the past three years, we also have deepened our mission commitment to be a critical presence where there is critical need by providing grants to and providing space for local non-profit partners in ministry whose work extends Jesus' vision of the kingdom of God:

Fight for the powerless.

"I was hungry and you gave me food, I was thirsty and you gave me something to drink, I was a stranger and you welcomed me, I was naked and you gave me clothing, I was sick and you took care of me, I was in prison and you visited me."

Our community partners extend Rincon's commitment to Jesus' call to serve the poorest, most marginalized, and oppressed including migrants and refugees, adults and teens who are homeless, at-risk youth, glbtq youth and adults, people with serious

This past weekend’s three-day “Sacred Conversations on Race” event, including “Songs of Struggle and Freedom” concert with Lisa Otey and Dianne Van Duerzen and the Rev. Dr. Jennifer Harvey’s “Exploring Whiteness” conference and “Who Are Your People?” sermon drew approximately 250 people to our campus, at least fifty of whom were visitors.
